| Blueberry Jubilee        | Powder-Blue | 500        | ✓             |       | Mid season / Medium to large very sweet fruit. Semi-evergreen, compact, heatresistant shrub. May have yellow-burgandy color if cold enough.  |
| Blueberry Misty          | Powder-Blue | 150        | ✓             |       | Early season / Medium to large sweet fruit. Very high yield with another blueberry. Attractive blue-green shrub for areas for mild winters and hot summers.  |
| Blueberry O'Neal         | Powder-Blue | 200        | ✓             |       | Early season / Large juicy sweet fruit. Bush 5-6' tall, fall color. 4.5-5.5 pH soil is recommended for success with this type. Plant another variety for larger crops.   |
| Blueberry Pink Lemonade  | Bright Pink |            |               |       | Translucent berries mature to a luscious bright pink and taste wonderfully sweet with a firm, clear texture.   |
| Blueberry Sharpblue      | Powder-Blue | 200        | ✓             |       | Sept.-Dec. / Large mild sweet fruit. Height to 6' and evergreen.   |

| Blueberry Top Hat        | Powder-Blue | 1000       | ✓             | ✓     | Mid season / Pea sized firm fruit with good flavor. Dwarf to 2' has great fall color. Perfect for pots.  |
| Boysenberry Thornless    | Maroon      |            | ✓             |       | Summer / 2.5" fruit with few seeds have an intense tangy-sweet flavor. This "thornless" vine is less thorny then regular Boysenberry. Be aware you will still need gloves to prune!  |
| Goji Berry               | Bright Red  |            | ✓             |       | Summer / Tiny oblong berry that gets sweeter as it ripens on deciduous canes. Highest antioxidant level of any fruit. Use fresh or dried. Drought tolerant and has thorns as it matures which can be pruned off. Trellis to keep fruit off the ground. |
| Gooseberry Black Velvet  | Purple      |            | ✓             |       | Summer/Allow large berries to ripen fully on the vine for best sweet-tart taste. Thorny shrub grows 3', productive and disease resistant. Afternoon shade in hot climates. High in antioxidants, anthocyanins, fiber, potassium, & Vitamins C & A.     |
| Raspberry Canby Red      | Red         |            | ✓             |       | June-July/Thornless. Large to very large fruit are firm, juicy and of fine flavor. Viroid and aphid resistant.   |

| Rainier              | Yellow red     | 800        |               |            | Mid season / Pollenize with Van, Lambert, Lapins, Black Tartarian and Bing. / Large, cherry with distinctive flavor. Heavy production if given enough chill.   |
| Royal Crimson        | Bright Crimson | Low        | ✓             |            | Low-chill sweet cherry with superb flavor.   |
| Royal Lee            | Red            | 300        |               |            | Mid season / Pollenized by Minnie Royal / Medium, very firm, fine quality cherry. Very productive for the low chill areas.   |
| Stella (Compact)     | Dark red       | 600        | ✓             | ✓          | Mid season/ Large, firm dark flesh with good flavor and texture. Mature height is only 10-12'. Resistant to cracking and problems associated with rains near harvest time. Bears young. Good pollinizer. |

| Crimson         | Red         | 100        | ✓             |       | Oct.- Nov. / A CA. introduction from Fresno, fast becoming one of the most important table grape in the state. Seedless with lg. berries in med. clusters. Crisp flesh with good sweet flavor. |
| Himrod          | Light-Green |            | ✓             |       | Aug.- Sept. / Highest quality green grapes are seedless and ripen early. Sweet berries are in lg. loose clusters. Cane prune.  |
| Ladyfingers     | Light-Green |            | ✓             |       | Sept.-Oct. / Seeded table grape, rich tangy flavor with a thick skin which resists cracking. Attractive clusters for the fruit bowl. Large elongated berry. Cane or spur prune                 |
| Princess        | Light-Green |            | ✓             |       | August / Large grape with slight muscat flavor when very ripe and exposed to sun. Holds well on the vine. Fresh or dried. Cane prune. Seedless.  |

| Placentia        |             | 300        | ✓             |       | Fall/ Medium sized nut with fairly well sealed thin shells, plump kernel, mild flavor.   |
| Robert Livermore | Red kernal  |            |               |       | October / Small to medium with a good shell seal. Introduced in 1999 from University of California. One of a kind nut is perfect for specialty markets. Pollenizer Franquette. |

Bitter when green, matures to a complex blend of buttery and tropical flavors. Tolerant of cold, salinity, drought and resistant to olive knot.   |
